Remember where you first read about
Linton Property Developments. Established in 2010, the company has recently
completed its first multi-unit scheme at
TWO SIX EIGHT, Chelsea, SW10. Built
in 1865 as a pub (latterly known as the
Fulham Tup), the five-storey building sits on
the corner of Fulham Road and Redcliffe
Gardens. 'This may be one of the busiest
junctions in Chelsea, but you can't hear
a thing,' says Gary Linton, who has fitted
quadruple glazing to the original curv³

ing sash windows and teamed them with cast-iron radiators, countryside kitchens and iPad-controlled Lutron systems. Prices start through Strutt & Parker (020 7244 1279) and Beaney Pearce (020 7225 4362) from $\pounds 975,000$ for a 583sq ft one-bedroom flat that went under offer prior to launch. The four two-bedroom apartments range from $\pounds 1,550,000$ to $\pounds 2,250,000$, while $\pounds 2,950,000$ will secure the 1,759sq ft three-bedroom duplex with its fabulous loft-like living space on the fourth floor.
